

31 THINGS TO DO IN THE HARVEY REGION

HARVEY REGION ROADTRIP BUCKET LIST



1. VINEYARD 28

Stroll through the vineyards on a mini-Italian escape. Take their *A Taste of Italy* tour to discover the winemaking process or book the *28 Wine + Grazing Experience*.

3. LAKE BROCKMAN

A sparkling blue lake set among lush green forest is calling your name. Lake Brockman is the perfect spot for camping, glamping, or a day of water sports.

4. MUNDA BIDI! TRAIL

Officially the world's longest continuous off-road MTB cycling track. Lonely Planet and Nat Geo named it one of the world's top 10 cycling tracks.

5. THE BIG ORANGE & HARVEY RIVER ESTATE

At Harvey River Estate, climb the 14-metre tower and find yourself inside the Big Orange – an iconic landmark celebrating Harvey's citrus scene. Afterwards, reward yourself with a wine tasting.

7. HARVEY FARM BARN

When was the last time you had a picnic with a goat? Head to Harvey Farm Barn for a Meet the Farm Animals self-guided tour, and don't miss the sunflowers in season. Pack your hamper or grab something from their small coffee whole-in-the-wall. Note – limited opening hours.

6. YALGORUP NATIONAL PARK

Explore the largest national park on the Swan Coastal Plain and a world-recognised RAMSAR wetland. Grab your binoculars and go birdwatching around Lake Preston.

8. HARVEY INTERMENT CAMP MEMORIAL SHRINE

During WWII, Italian and German migrants living in allied countries were interned at camps around Australia, including Camp No 11 Harvey. Pay your respects to this unique shrine that was built by the internees.

9. THE BOOLA BIDI DREAMING CENTRE & NOONGAR KAARTDIJIN BIDEE TRAIL

Immerse yourself in the ancient Noongar culture with workshops, guided walking tours, and cultural ceremonies. Check out the wares in the retail store and then venture under the Harvey River Bridge to experience the Noongar Kaartdijin Bidee Trail.

10. STIRLING COTTAGE GARDENS & MAY GIBBS

Find an enchanting garden, mini orchard, river walks, and the Stirling Cottage Kitchen tearooms—a replica of the 1850s cottage that was home to Governor Sir James Stirling and the creator of Snugglypot and Cuddlepip, author May Gibbs.

11. HARVEY DAM

Harvey Dam has something for everyone! It's a great place to go canoeing, fishing, trail-walking, riding, or just relaxing, with great facilities and beautiful scenery.

12. GIBBS POOL & AMPHITHEATRE

On the shores of the Harvey Dam, you will find the beautiful Gibbs Pool and Amphitheatre. Pack a lunch and make use of the BBQs and playground. Take the Dick Lofthouse Rotary Walk, which climbs the 45-metre embankment to a scenic lookout spot.

13. WILDFLOWER RIDGE WALK

Wander through a riotous bloom of native flowers as you enjoy breathtaking views of the Harvey Dam and sweeping scenes of the coastal plains.

14. KANGA ART AT MIAMI BAKEHOUSE

After sampling one of their award-winning pies, hop around the grounds of the Miami Bakehouse and admire their mob of uniquely designed kangaroos.

15. WONDERS OF WA MINI GOLF & OLD COAST ROAD BREWERY

Discover WA's most loved natural icons with a round of mini golf like no others. Explore a different WA attraction at each hole, then grab a bite at Old Coast Brewery.

16. THE CROOKED CARROT

One of the region's largest carrot producers is behind this highly successful cafe serving fabulous coffee, breakfast, lunch and sweet treats.

17. HARVEY CHEESE & ST. DUKES DISTILLERY

A cheese-lovers paradise is awaiting you in Wokalup! Pop in for a free tasting of their famous handmade cheese and browse a range of local gourmet goodies. Adjacent, you will find the St Dukes Distillery, and the perfect accompaniment to cheese.

18. BRUGAN BREWERY

Craft beer drinkers can't go past Brugan. The microbrewery uses locally produced hops in their brews and serve some of the best meals in the Region!

19. GEOVINO

A beverage and foodie's dream! Stock up on local wines, craft beers, gourmet cheeses, pate, olives, giftwares, and more. Enjoy a glass of wine, refreshing gin or a delicious beer with characterie boards while you shop.

20. CYCLING ADVENTURES

Cycling along the Harvey Region's coastal and hinterland roads is one of life's great pleasures. You'll find open roads that wind their way through idyllic dairy country hinterland to hill climbs that will get your legs burning and reward you with sensational views.

21. BINNINGUP BEACH

Hinterlands not your thing? The coastal hamlet of Binningup has one of the best beaches in WA – perfect for fishing, soaking up the sun or testing the new 4WD.

22. LESCHENAULT PENINSULA CONSERVATION PARK

Only minutes from Australind, the Leschenault Peninsula has a stunning location between the Indian Ocean and the serene Leschenault Estuary. Experience endless white beaches, great fishing, bush walking, camping, wildlife, and a unique Indian history.

23. LESCHENAULT ESTUARY & AUSTRALIND JETTY

Extending about one kilometre over the protected waters of Leschenault Estuary (Derbal Elaap), the Australind Jetty offers breathtaking views of the 13km long Estuary. Say hi to the Black Swans and our dolphins.

24. MELVILLE PARK & FRIENDS FARM SHOP

This historic farm dating to the mid-1880s on the banks of the Brunswick River has a produce-driven shop with heirloom vegetables, decadent cheese, and much more. Open every Saturday morning.

25. BRUNSWICK RIVER PRECINCT

Enjoy an invigorating dip on a hot summer day at Brunswick River Pool – a picturesque section of the Brunswick River. Or, stretch your legs on the Brunswick River Walk Trail that winds along the Brunswick River to Shines Crescent, Brunswick.

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26. BIG HADDY – BIG JARRAH HADFIELD TREE

Feeling adventurous? Then head deep into the Mornington State Forest and see if you can find the Big Jarrah tree which is 260 years old, has a 10m circumference, and is on the National Register of Big Trees!

27. COW ON THE CORNER

Daisy – Brunswick's life-size town mascot – pays tribute to the local dairy industry. Afterwards, head across the road to Brunswick Tavern for a delicious feed.

28. TREENDALE FARM HOTEL

Hungry yet? Officially Australia's Best Family Dining experience, if you need a feed, The Farm is the place to be. Bring your appetite because this pub does it BIG!

29. RIDLEY PLACE FORESHORE

After grabbing a cuppa at Benesse, relax and look over the estuary while the kids climb the giant Blue Swimmer Crab at Karragarup Play Space.

30. FEATURED WOOD GALLERY & MUSEUM

A wondrous place of fine wood craftsmanship combined with a unique Australian and American history museum. There is a larger-than-life display on Ned Kelly and much more.

31. HENTON COTTAGE & AUSTRALIND ARTISANS COLLECTIVE

Uncover history, art, and craft. The State Heritage Listed Henton Cottage (1841) is part of the original Australind settlement and home to Australind Artisan Collective. Across the road is Saint Nicholas Anglican Church (1840s), the smallest and cutest church in Western Australia.
